Highlights

August 15th Traffic Stop Results in Drug Arrest







On August 15th, 2024, around 8:30 P.M., a Deputy with the Boone County Sheriff's Office Criminal Intelligence Unit (CIU) observed a vehicle speeding north on Interstate 65. After the vehicle abruptly slowed down and changed lanes without signaling, the Deputy pursued and initiated a traffic stop on a black four-door sedan with a temporary license plate. During the stop, the Deputy detected the smell of marijuana, prompting a probable cause search.

The search revealed approximately 8.71 pounds of oxycodone pills suspected to contain fentanyl, 1.5 pounds of marijuana, a large sum of U.S. currency, and counterfeit money. The driver, Richard Mckee, was booked into the Boone County Jail on preliminary charges, including dealing in a narcotic drug, counterfeiting, and dealing in marijuana.
